- The American Motorcycle Association was officially established in 1924 (taking over Gypsy tours)
- According to their website, this rally includes: "bike shows of all kinds, swap meets, poker runs, gypsy tours, contests, vendors, live music, and of course- beautiful riding."
- The Rally Headquarters is located on Lakeside Avenue in Weirs Beach

#### Here are some neat details about The Cog:

- You begin at The Marshfield Base Station (2700' above sea level)
- At the top of the mountain is The Observatory Museum and the historic Tiptop House
- The Wajo Nantasis was the first Mount Washington Cog Railway Biodiesel Locomotive
- The Cog is a National Historic Engineering Landmark

### Cruises on Lake Winnipesaukee

Lake Winnipesaukee is a stunning place to spend a day or the entire weekend! Here are some highlights:

- You can take any of the following cruises around the lake:
  Scenic, Sunset Dinner, Sunday Brunch or an Island Mailboat.
- Cruises on this lake are perfect for private events such as weddings, company outings or proms
- According to the CruiseNH website, "the first vessel [to cruise Lake Winnepesaukee] was a wooden side-wheeler 178 feet in length with a beam of 49 feet. It was built and launched in 1872 at Alton Bay, New Hampshire. Referred to today as the "Old Mount"
- The Mount has a capacity of 1250 passengers

### The Appalachian Trail


The Appalachian Trail is an incredible experience whether you are doing a long-term hiking excursion or a day trip. In fact, according to The Appalachian Trail Conservancy, "New Hampshire features more miles above treeline than any other Trail state."

Here are some fun facts to consider prior to hiking the New Hampshire section of The Appalachian Trail:

- There are 161 hike-able miles in the state of New Hampshire
- The hike is rated easy to difficult
- The elevations range from 400-6,288'
